


## \*Baby Boomer (1946 – 64)

The NZEI (Primary teachers' union)

Last week the "Post," ran a front page, half page, story headed "Principals in Crisis. "An NZEI survey of 629 principals, found 30% who said they would leave the profession within the next two years."

The survey resulted in, "burnt out primary school principals in Aotearoa are meeting today for a nationwide "crisis summit."

One of the responses in a subsequent NZEI bulletin stated.

"We need to make sure being a principal is something that more teachers aspire to be. This will be done by sharing positive messages about what is great about the job while also working to address the systemic issues that make the role so challenging."

I agree with this sentiment but it will be hard to achieve if the public and teachers who are aspiring leaders, continue to be fed the negative, bleating, narrative we were subject to in this week's "Post." article. It painted a picture of principals weeping tears of blood whilst existing in a solitary island of despair.

I was a principal for 20 years and while things were difficult at times - as is the case in most leadership roles, whether in a school or otherwise - most of the time it was exciting and fun. I never felt unsupported in that time. I owe a lot to successive Boards of Trustees, the wonderful staffs I have worked with, other principals, the MOE (most of the time) The NZEI on the odd occasion and certainly, whanau in all the schools I worked in. 
