### **Property Update**

Work has begun to re-roofing our library and adjacent areas to make this space watertight. As most of you are aware, the flat butynol roof has been leaking for a number of years so we need to replace damaged roofing, walls and windows. This means new areas will now be enclosed to create the pitched roof.

### NZEI Te Riu Roa (Teachers Union) 1 March - School will be OPEN

NZEI Te Riu Roa leaders are calling paid union meetings for members to discuss and consider important issues including:

- Ensuring pay and working conditions are sufficient to attract and keep people in teaching.
- Advocating to effectively improve support for children's teaching and learning, including increasing staffing, learning support specialists and reducing class size.
- Make school leadership roles manageable and desirable.

The meetings will include voting on the outcome of negotiations between NZEI Te Riu Roa and the Ministry of Education for the renewal of members' collective agreements.

Houghton Valley School will remain open but we will be merging classrooms from 1.30pm on 1 March so teachers can attend the meeting. You will need to collect your child from different learning spaces on that day - Years 1-2 from Harakeke, Years 3-4 from Pohutukawa and Years 5-6 from Rata at 2.55pm

## **Medical Information, Emergency Contacts and Emergency Food Kits**
