Hauora at Haewai

Over the past few years, we have added a number of new Hauora strategies and tools to our kete to support the needs and the ongoing demands that our tamariki have had to face over the past 3 years.

We have been a Positive Behaviour for Learning(PB4L) kura for the past 7 years. This means we work from a Corrective learning model and not a punitive one.

One of the ways we show that we are a PB4L school is by using the Restorative Conversation process to work through the issues and the harm that is caused. It is important that we can reach an agreement and a way forward for both parties. This makes our tamariki feel safe and supported, stops the issue from festering, or getting bigger.

Messaging we give to our tamariki:

- ask an adult to help and if you need support ask a friend to come with you
- let an adult know at school as soon as possible duty teacher, classroom teacher or the Principal
- tell your whānau what happen so that they can support you and they know what agreement has been made
- if you see things happening that are not okay be an Upstander and come and get help or give help by checking on the person involved

Tools and Strategies we use at school				
Circle Time	to discuss issues and behaviours, not isolating the person, group problem- solving			
Zones of Regulation	support learners to understand how to be in their best learning space and what their triggers are			
Restorative conversations	to resolve problems between different groups/individuals			
Individual Behaviour Plans (IBP)				
Data collection	To identify common behaviours. We use this to plan circle time sessions or an IBP for an individual, or to do some staff professional development			


- **Bystander:** a person who sees or knows a bullying incident is occurring to someone else.
- Upstander: a person who uses words and actions that can help someone who is being bullied.
 There are a range of helpful actions you can take if you feel safe enough to do so.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES - FEBRUARY UPDATE

Kia ora koutou

With the 2023 school year already at full steam ahead, we wanted to introduce ourselves and let you know some of the key areas of work coming up for the Board of Trustees (BOT) this year.

Who are we?

The BOT is responsible for the governance and strategic direction of the school. Our BOT consists of parent representatives - Seb Bishop (Presiding Member), Bret McKenzie, Mike Brough and Ana Tovey; a staff-elected representative - Stephanie Bosch; and the HVS Principal Luana Carroll. We are lucky to have Emily Faith supporting us as Secretary. You can find out more about us - and how to spot us around the school - in our bios below.

Georgie Ferrari has resigned from the BOT. We thank her for the time and expertise that she contributed over the two years that she was a member.

What's the Board up to in 2023?

2023 is a busy year for our kura and the BOT. You will likely already be aware of one of the main pieces of work taking place - the water tightening and update of the library and the block of classrooms from Harakeke to Ngaio, which the BOT is overseeing.

Another major focus for the BOT this year is developing the HVS three-year strategic plan, which will replace our annually-reviewed school charter from 2024 onwards (this is part of new legislation to improve how schools plan and report). Strategic planning shapes our objectives and actions for the year, and ensures the BOT can monitor and report on progress.

We will invite the school community to feed into this process, to share your aspirations and needs for the vision and future of HVS. The information gathered in community consultation makes a meaningful impact in shaping the direction of the school e.g in the last strategic review you told us to stick with single cell classroom spaces, and so in our upcoming classroom refresh we'll be keeping the single cell spaces.

We're awaiting further information from the Ministry, and will then share a timeline for the review and consultation.

The BOT is also working to improve and consolidate how we communicate with our school community and how we let prospective whānau know what makes our kura so special. We're starting with a refresh of the school website.
